Instructions for Application

Obtaining authorization to prescribe Schedule II controlled substances as a Certified Registered Nurse Practitioner/Certified Nurse Midwife or Physician Assistant requires that you first apply for, and be granted a Limited Purpose Schedule II Permit.

Read the *Rules and Regulations* pertaining to the LPSP (Alabama Board of Medical examiners, Administrative Rules. Chapter 540-X-20 should answer most of your questions).

AN APPLICATION FOR THE LIMITED PURPOSE SCHEDULE II PERMIT SHOULD INCLUDE:

- _____ (1) Current / Active Qualified Alabama Controlled Substance Certificate
- _____ (2) Completed Application and payment of \$25.00
- _____ (3) Completed Formulary to include the generic and brand names for each medication you are requesting.
- _____ (4) Completed Covering Agreement for any physician who is an approved covering physician on your Collaborative Agreement/Registration Agreement and QACSC and with whom you will be working.

QACSC License Renewal is an Annual Requirement

LPSP renewal notices will be mailed early in the month of October each year. They will be mailed to the Mid-Level Practitioner's mailing address of record. It is the Mid-Level Practitioner's responsibility to keep the Board of Medical Examiners apprised of their current address. Licenses that are not renewed will become inactive on January 1st. Without a current and active LPSP you will not be allowed to prescribe any Schedule II controlled substances.
