

SUBSTANCE OF PROPOSED ACTION: To delete the prohibition from signing prescriptions for controlled substances in light of Physician Assistants' ability to write controlled substances prescriptions pursuant to Ala. Code §§ 20-2-60 et seq.

540-X-7-.31 Forms Requiring a Physician's Signature - Physician Assistant

(P.A.).

(1)——Unless prohibited by Federal or state statutes or regulations or by the agency governing a specific form, a physician assistant may sign any form which can be authenticated by the supervising physician's signature, if signing by the physician assistant is authorized by the supervising physician.

~~(2)——Physician assistants are prohibited from signing prescriptions for controlled substances.~~
